Prayer as Receiving, Not Achieving

The focus remains on prayer next week, with special attention to who gets God's ear and why. We don't have to be perfect to pray, or even say the perfect prayer. It is more important to allow some room for God to work in us. This is more likely to happen when we bow our heads in recognition of who God is and who we are.

■ FIRST READING

*The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds
(Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18).*

Once again we hear that God's ways are not like our ways. While we tend to show partiality to those who are rich and powerful, God reaches out and embraces those who are weak and powerless. They are the chosen ones of God, for they recognize that they cannot survive without intervention. God hears the prayers of the poor and weak and responds to their needs. We hear that the "prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal."

■ SECOND READING

*From now on, the crown of righteousness awaits me
(2 Timothy 4:6-7, 16-18).*

St. Paul wrote to Timothy while he was in prison facing the possibility of a death sentence. We cannot be absolutely sure that Paul wrote it. Nevertheless, there is a beauty in the attitude expressed: that Paul views his life as a libation. He speaks of his ministry and his life as a sacrifice poured out to obtain the salvation of those to whom he preached. Even when no one stood by him to

defend him, Paul believed that God would never abandon him. There are many moments in our life when we are sure that no one could possibly understand what is happening to us. It is at such moments that Paul's words can be a great consolation to us.

■ GOSPEL

*The tax collector, not the Pharisee, went home justified
(Luke 18:9-14).*

Jesus tells of two men, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisees were a group of dedicated Jewish laymen who attempted to practice the law as fully as possible. They even "built a fence around the law," meaning that they took the law to its widest possible extent to be sure that they observed the smallest part of the law. This made this particular Pharisee feel good about himself. He had become self-righteous and felt that he was doing God a favor in all that he did. The tax collector had the opposite attitude. Tax collecting was an unclean profession. He knew he was a sinner, so he approached God with humility. He was forgiven while the Pharisee was not (he did not feel he needed forgiveness).

■ REFLECTION

It's not that the Pharisee's prayer is a bad prayer. It starts out well: "O God, I thank you..." Gratitude is good. But then it gets into boasting: "I am not like the rest of humanity... I fast... I pay tithes" (Luke 18:11, 12). It's a Little Jack Horner prayer. Remember the old nursery rhyme that ends with Jack saying, "What a good boy am I?" The Pharisee's prayer is all about him and what he does, all the while gauging the distance between himself and the rest of humankind. In contrast, the tax collector "stood off at a distance" with bowed head, beating his breast and saying, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" (18:13). He knows who he is and who God is and what God alone can do for him. No repetitive "I," no swelling ego there, just a repentant figure, one who asks to receive what only God can give: mercy. Jesus tells this story "to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else" (18:9). How do we hear it? It acknowledges God who makes us "just," that is, who helps us to be in proper relationship with God, with each other, and with all creation. Sirach reminds us that our just God hears the cry of the oppressed, the wail of the orphan, the complaint of the widow, the petition of those who serve God willingly, and the prayer of the lowly. These folk allow room for God to enter their minds and hearts, and then all kind of things can begin to happen, both within and all around them.

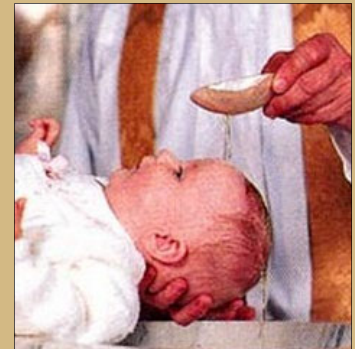

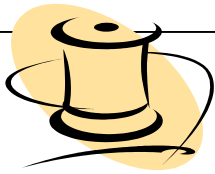


Flu Shot Clinic — **TODAY!**

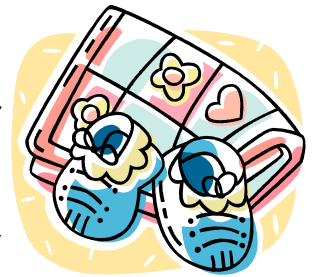

Dear (Representative/Senator) _____,

During this fall's veto session in Springfield, legislation to abolish the death penalty will be before you for your consideration. As a constituent in your district, I urge you to support this legislation. Ten years after the moratorium of the death penalty was first instituted in Illinois, there are still problems and abuses in the system that cannot be fully prevented, leaving the potential for wrongful convictions.

Under the current means available in our society, the death penalty is not necessary because the safety of others and protection of human life can be accomplished through alternatives, such as sentences of life imprisonment. We have the capability to both protect society and punish serious offenders without taking their lives. Offenders of such serious and violent crimes can be effectively incarcerated for life. The use of the death penalty when there are other means to protect our society weakens the respect for all human life.

Therefore, I urge you and the rest of the General Assembly to **pass legislation to abolish the death penalty** in Illinois. I thank you for your time and hope you will support the end of the death penalty in Illinois.

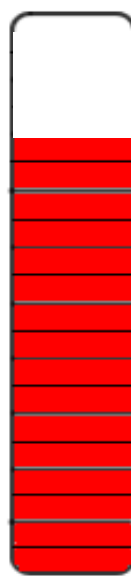

Zelie Martin**

**LOUIS AND ZELIE
MARTIN ARE THE
PARENTS OF SAINT
THERESE OF LISIEUX.**

They are the first parents of a saint in the Catholic Church to be lifted up by the Church for beatification as a married couple. They demonstrate to us that holiness begins at home, and Louis and Zelie kept God at the center of the family. They believed that it was their duty to impart the faith they had received to their children, as promised at their children’s baptisms. Zelie and Louis lived that promise by providing their family with a deep love for God and his Church.



Their lives were not so different from our modern day homes: they both worked outside of the home to provide for their daughters, and they struggled with many challenges, balancing child care, work, home duties and caring for aging parents. Prayer played an intimate role in their lives, and God was at the center of their lives and all of their decisions. Zelie Martin died in 1977 after struggling with breast cancer. This left Louis a single parent raising five daughters, all of whom would eventually become Carmelite sisters. They survived the Franco-Prussian war, loss of four infant children, and experienced the death of their mother, but the Martin family never lost their faith in God, remaining close to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

The sanctity of Louis and Zelie Martin was not because they were the parents of a saint, but because of their devotion to God and family and the covenant of marriage. They were beatified at the Basilica of Saint Therese in Lisieux, France on Mission Sunday, Oct. 19, 2008.


