### The Thief Who Stole Paradise

Only Luke gives us the story of the “good thief” at Calvary, emphasizing that, up to the very end, Jesus remained the “Son of Man who came to seek and save what was lost” (Luke 19:10). In Jesus we see the compassion of God at work in His final moments and in the most extreme agony.

#### ■ FIRST READING

*They anointed David king of Israel (2 Samuel 5:1-3).*

In the early days after the death of Saul, the 10 tribes of the north had a son of Saul as their king, while the two southern tribes had David. After the death of Saul’s son, all of the tribes of Israel claimed David as their king. David was to be their shepherd. God was the shepherd of Israel, and David was now being made God’s vicar upon the earth. That is why the king of Israel was proclaimed to be the Son of God on the day of his enthronement.

#### ■ SECOND READING

*He transformed us to the kingdom of his beloved Son (Colossians 1:12-20).*

The early Church struggled to develop concepts to understand who Jesus was. Here it calls Him an icon of the Father. Icons were considered to be representations of the Holy One. Jesus is thus the visible manifestation of the invisible glory of God. Jesus is presented as the Wisdom of God. In the Old Testament Wisdom was an attribute of God, the architect who assisted Him at creation and the revelation of God’s will. All things are under Jesus’ dominion. In Greek philosophy, that which was spiritual was superior to that which was material. Was Jesus inferior to the angels? This hymn tells us that

everything, visible and invisible, is under his care. Jesus is also the head of the Church and the firstborn from the dead. As the firstborn, He is both the first of those who would rise from the dead and the best. He brought about our justification with God through His death and resurrection, and He has provided us a way to live in that justification by giving us the Church.

#### ■ GOSPEL

*Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom (Luke 23:35-43).*

We acknowledge Jesus as the king of the universe. Yet, He is the king who does not sit upon a throne but hangs from a cross. He does not wear a crown of gold, but a crown of thorns. Jesus is most a king when He is dying upon the cross. The crowds mocked Jesus with the titles “chosen one of God,” “the Christ of God,” and the “King of the Jews.” These are true titles, but this would only be understood when Jesus had risen from the dead. They call upon Jesus to save Himself as He had saved others. The irony is that He was saving others in the very act of not saving Himself. This is the only Gospel that speaks of the good thief who defends Jesus. Jesus had come to save those who were lost and most needed his love. He forgives the good thief with an invitation to paradise.

#### ■ REFLECTION

When we think of Christ the King, we usually do not think of Jesus hanging on the cross, but rather the risen Christ, seated at the right hand of the Father, wearing the crown bestowed upon him by the Father. But Luke presents us with an image of Christ whose reign begins on the cross with His promise of Paradise to a thief hanging at his side. Jesus brings about the kingdom even in the last moment of his life, extending the mercy of God to yet another nameless outsider, a thief “condemned justly” to death (Luke 23:41). This man recognizes Jesus both as a man who “has done nothing criminal,” but also one who is about to “come into [His] kingdom” (23:41,42). The kingdom of God that Jesus proclaimed as being “already in your midst” is present in Jesus on the cross, extending mercy by asking God to forgive those who have crucified Him, for “they know not what they do” (23:34). To the thief who asks Jesus to remember him, Jesus promises “Today you will be with Me in Paradise” (23:43). What wonderful words to bring the Church year to a close. The crucified One Himself, being the King of Hearts, the Shepherd King lifted up one last time, a beloved sheep who had wandered far astray but unexpectedly found himself at heaven’s door. If we call Him King, it is because He was faithful to His calling, not to save Himself, but us.

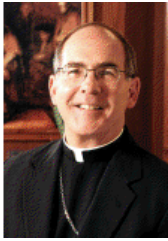

**Fight Poverty in America.  
Defend Human Dignity.**

**Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

The Collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is approaching in our diocese. This Collection supports works of charity and justice by funding community groups whose goals are to solve problems and change policies that keep low-income residents in poverty.

One Florida group receiving funding from CCHD, composed of 20 churches, is called Hillsborough Organization for Progress and Equality (HOPE). HOPE stepped in to support children at risk of school failure. The group worked with the school district to develop a program through which suspended students attend a supervised site during their suspension. There, they do schoolwork, receive academic help from a teacher, and spend time with a counselor to deal with the underlying problems that led to suspension. Students who may have become stuck in a cycle of misbehavior and punishment are now improving their conflict management and academic skills, setting the stage for a more secure future.

Groups who receive funding from CCHD find problems that affect them and then work to find just solutions. Through CCHD, the Catholic Church is working to seek justice and reflect Catholic social teaching. Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty by supporting CCHD in the upcoming Collection. Please remember: 25% of our local Collection's proceeds stays here in our diocese to fight poverty in our communities and defend the dignity of our neighbors.

As you may recall, there was significant controversy last year over some of the groups that were funded nationally by CCHD. As a result of a thorough investigation, a very small percentage of the funded organizations were found to be in violation of CCHD policies and lost their grants. There was understandable concern that any such groups received proceeds from this collection. To prevent this problem from happening again, the US Catholic Bishops will be voting at their November meeting on a major overhaul of CCHD program. Among the measures being considered are much stricter controls over which groups receive grants to ensure that the goals and practices of all funded organizations are in line with Catholic teaching.

**Saint of the Week  
St. Frances  
Xavier Cabrini  
1850-1917**

**FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI** was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.



Refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher, she began charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit.

When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named Frances prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Seven young women from the orphanage joined with her. Since her early childhood in Italy, Frances had wanted to be a missionary in China but, at the urging of Pope Leo XIII, Frances went west instead of east. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there.

She found disappointment and difficulties with every step. When she arrived in New York City, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But Frances, truly a valiant woman, departed from the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish that orphanage. And she did.

In 35 years Frances Xavier Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes.

As a child, she was always frightened of water, unable to overcome her fear of drowning. Yet, she traveled across the Atlantic Ocean more than 30 times. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago.

At her canonization on July 7, 1946, Pius XII said, "Although her constitution was very frail, her spirit was endowed with such singular strength that, knowing the will of God in her regard, she permitted nothing to impede her from accomplishing what seemed beyond the strength of a woman."


